

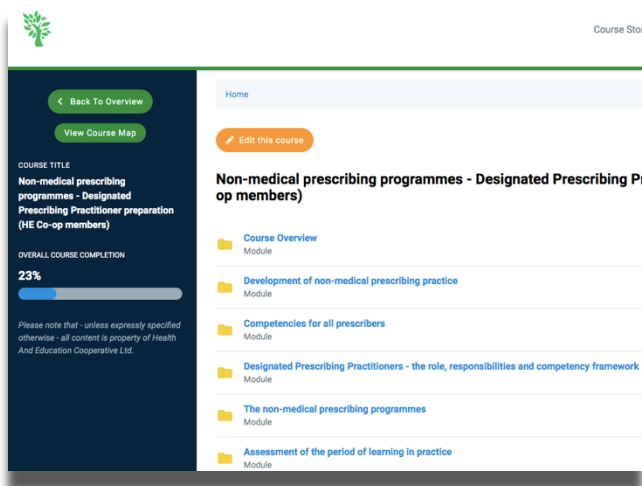
Designated Prescribing Practitioners

A resource for preparation

Regulatory body standards (of the General Pharmaceutical Council, 2019, the Health and Care Professions Council, 2019 and the Nursing and Midwifery Council, 2018) now permit appropriately qualified and experienced prescribers of all professions to act as supervisors and assessors of trainees undertaking programmes of preparation to prescribe. **However, the standards of the regulatory bodies also require that course providers ensure that supervisors and assessors of trainees are prepared and competent to undertake the role in order to assure the quality of learning and assessment, and safe and effective prescribing for patients and clients.**

WHAT is this resource?

- An e-resource designed to support the preparation of Designated Prescribing Practitioners

- Module certificates provide evidence of relevant preparation for the role of DPP
